ENGLISH

We will be writing our version of a narrative 'Conquering the Monster' tale, using the talk for writing process. We will develop positive attitudes towards and stamina for writing by: writing for different purposes and writing a newspaper article.

In our writing we aim to build confidence in our language features and to create exciting explanations by using subordination (using when, and because) and co-ordination (using or, and). We will look at exclamations and adverbs to create danger around the main character and show how he 'saves the day'. We will continue to learn to read and spell using RWI and by segmenting spoken words into phonemes and representing these by graphemes, spelling many correctly. We will also learn to spell common exception words. Our handwriting will have the correct spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters. We will continue to practise and use our new Nelson handwriting scheme across all curriculum subjects.
