ENGLISH

Our English lessons will be all about discussing, explaining and applying what we have learnt because if the children can explain it then they know it. The focus will then be applying it independently/with some support.

The aim is to build total confidence in our language features and the understanding and explaining of our learning to others. We will continue to prioritise proofreading our work for spelling and punctuation errors along with building upon our editing skills. We will incorporate dictionary skills into our guided reading and basic skills sessions to assist with our independence in writing.

Working independently, in pairs and in groups continues to be an important part of our lessons in Penguin class. Handwriting will continue to be a daily focus as we love to show off our wonderful writing.

RE

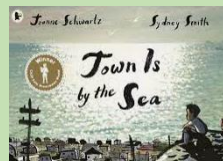
Spring term we will be starting our RE topic about Christianity.

History
